VICAR'S LETTER

"Now the green blade rises from the buried grain, wheat that in the dark earth many days has lain; love lives again, that with the dead has been:

Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green"

(Hymn words written by John Macleod Campbell Crum 1872-1958)

Dear Friends,

I can't tell you how much I enjoy noticing the spring flowers coming up, a simple, real joy and a lift to my heart in this season of Lent as winter and spring weather wrestle for dominance. One day we are wrapping up, walking in snow blizzards, and the next shedding a few layers, basking in early spring sunshine, warming our hearts and the frozen ground, as new life stirs in the natural world, rekindling our hope once again. As fellow pilgrims on the road, we journey in love through the season of Lent, preparing our hearts and lives for the closer walk with our Lord in Holy Week; through his passion and sufferings, his death on the cross, burial in a tomb, to the silent waiting of Holy Saturday, before the early morning joy of the Resurrection on Easter Day. As the hymn words remind us:

"Forth he came at Easter, like risen grain,
he that for the three days in the grave had lain,
Back from the dead my risen Lord is seen:

Love is come again, like wheat that springs up green".

I find it interesting that the story of Easter morning takes place in a garden. Early in the morning Mary Magdalene goes to the tomb, where she saw the body of Jesus being laid on Good Friday. To her dismay she finds that the tomb is now empty, and she jumps to the conclusion that someone has stolen the body. In her distress she hurries to find Peter and another disciple to tell them what she has found. They run to the tomb to confirm this news, and return to their

homes, leaving Mary standing beside the tomb, crying. Then two amazing events happen. Firstly, as Mary looks again into the tomb, she sees two angels, who ask her why she is weeping. Then, when she turns around, she encounters the Risen Lord. At first she thinks he is the gardener. But when he calls her name she realizes the wonderful truth that Jesus is risen from the dead, and joy fills her heart. All this takes place in the setting of a garden.

The word garden is mentioned many times in the Bible and is often used as a metaphor to describe our relationship with God. This is a fruitful image for Christian spirituality as we cultivate the gardens of our own hearts. But beautiful gardens don't just happen. They take a lot of time and work, pulling up weeds, cutting back, the planting of seeds for flowers, fruits, and vegetables, all to be watered and cared for, encouraging growth. Lent gives us opportunity to attend to our spiritual lives, as we are encouraged to grow deeper into God, holding onto the promise "you shall be like a watered garden" (Isaiah 58:11). Wherever we find ourselves this Lent, however our hearts may be, in preparation for Easter we are to be encouraged, making way for new life to spring up green:

"When our hearts are wintry, grieving or in pain,

Then your touch can call us back to life again,

Field of our hearts that dead and bare have been:

Love is come again, like wheat that springs up green".

The Easter Garden was an earthy place of simplicity and of profound encounter with Jesus and Mary. May our hearts be cultivated through our Lenten pilgrimage of prayer and discipline, that we may grow in grace and learn to be God's people once again. May our hearts be open to encounter with our Lord, such that we listen, and hear God calling us by name, so that our lives may be transformed by the joy of the resurrection at Easter.

Love will come again, like wheat that springs up green.

Happy Easter, when it comes!
