

## Public Worship - Welcome

Within our Church we believe that everyone is known and loved individually by God and that as many members within one body we are called to be responsible to and for one another, respecting the more vulnerable and sensitive whose suffering is our suffering. [I Corinthians 12.12-27]

At present:

The Sacrament of Holy Communion is celebrated every **Sunday at 10.00 am** *[including via Zoom]* and Thursday at 09.30 am. Additionally, Holy Communion *[Order Two traditional words]* Sundays at 8.00 am, usually takes place on the first Sunday of the month – please see notices and website for updates. Further services, particularly for Holy Week and Easter, and major feast days, will also be detailed at www.standrewschurchbiggleswade.org.uk.

- \* Holy Communion is administered in one kind from a covered ciborium; the President is the only person who will receive both the bread and the wine, after the sanitizing of hands. Administration practice will be reviewed before Easter 2022.
- \* If you do not normally receive Holy Communion, you are most welcome to come forward for a blessing: please carry the service booklet to indicate your wishes.
- \* At the time of The Peace, greetings may continue to be as previously a wave or verbal greeting from our seats.
- If you prefer to observe social distancing, please consult a sidesperson or churchwarden who will be pleased to direct you to a convenient area of church. Whenever possible, the north and south doors will remain open to maximise ventilation.
- \* Processions to include clergy and ministers, altar servers and the choir will recommence as from Palm Sunday
- \* Offertory plates for your donations are positioned near the north and south doors: there will not be a collection during our worship. Please Gift Aid your offerings if possible.
- \* Please sanitise your hands upon entry into church, and again on departing.
- \* Our Church is open for private prayer on Wednesdays and Saturdays, 09.00 am – 12.00 noon, unless otherwise notified.
